Curriculum Term 2 – Health and Physical Education



Dear Families,

The curriculum focus for Term 2 will be anchored in the Health and Physical Education curriculum where our students will develop the knowledge, understanding and skills to strengthen their sense of self, and build and manage satisfying relationships. This curriculum helps them to be resilient, and to make decisions and take actions to promote their health, safety and physical activity participation. The two key concepts underpinning this curriculum are **Choice** and **Lifestyle**.

Next term's curriculum has been expertly designed by our teachers to include the key knowledge which is relevant for each year level. Lessons will also provide our students with the opportunity to relate their developing knowledge of this curriculum to real life experiences. We look forward to the multiple opportunities our students will have to participate in physical activity next term with the upcoming Inter-school Sports Program – Football and Netball Years 5 &6), Swimming Program (F-6), District Cross Country (3-6) and District Soccer, Football and Netball Lightning Premierships (Years 5 & 6). We will also be introducing The Resilience Project to our community and Healthy Harold from the Life Education Van will also be stopping by for a visit. SWIMMING

All students from Foundation to Year 6 will be participating in 8 swimming lessons delivered across 2 weeks mid next term. The Years 3-6 students will have the opportunity to put their running shoes on and participate in some training based at school before the big day. More information will be provided early next term.


We look forward to an actively engaged term of learning. By the end of Term 2 our students are likely to be healthier, happier and 'holiday ready' again.

Literacy Corner

Dear Families,

What a busy term it's been for Literacy learning across the school. Our students have had opportunities to practise their reading, writing, spelling; and speaking and listening skills during the daily 2 hour Literacy block. Here is a snapshot of the wonderful learning that has taken place during the term.

The Foundation students are engaged in hands-on rotation activities using their SMART spelling words. Each week, the students have a different word and sentence as their focus.





Year 5/6 have been practising their speaking by presenting their Australian Prime Minister research projects (slides or a poster) to their class mates. They have prepared key word cards so that they can maintain eye contact with their audience. In addition, they have talked about speaking clearly at the right volume and using expression to engage an audience. During the presentations, students have been practising respectful and whole body listening. At the end of each presentation, the speaker has selected three students to make constructive comments about the presentation - what worked well and how they could have made it even better.







In Year 1/2 they have been learning about the different letter sounds. Today we played alphabet bingo where we had to say the name of the letter and the sound the letter makes

(sometimes a letter can make more than one sound). We used rhyming cards with pictures. We worked with Mrs. Clausen

on our vocabulary to work out what the pictures were and then we identified the different words that rhyme.

In Year 3/4 students have been working on writing a variety of text types such as recounts, newspaper reports and Narratives. An important component of



the Writing process is that students can edit their own writing to check that it makes sense, spelling, grammar and punctuation. Students have also had an opportunity to edit their peers' writing and provide them with feedback.


